## How to reach the Conference Venue

#### By Air

The nearest Airport is Jamshedpur Airport 120 km & Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Airport, Kolkata 188 km.

#### **Bv Rail**

The distance between Kolkata to Jhargram is 154 km by Train. From Howrah or Tata Nagar, take the Express/Local Train to reach Jhargram Station, Minimum time to reach Jhargram from Kolkata is 2.5 hours & from Tata Nagar is 1 hour.

#### By Road

The distance between Kolkata and Jhargram is 178 km by Road, From Kolkata via NH6 (Mumbai-Kolkata Highway) by Car, you can reach Jhargram within 4-hour journey. Frequent non-AC buses (SBSTC) from Kolkata (Esplanade & Garia) are available, which reach Jhargram within 4.5 hours.



Kanak Durga Temple

King Gopinath built this 500-year-old temple. The king dreamt of the idol of Goddess Kanak Durga. As the name suggests, Kanak, the 2 feet idol, is made of pure Gold. It is believed that human sacrifice formed a vital ritual at that time which continued till sacrificial blood reached the Dulung River. A visit to Kanak Durga Temple gives a thrilling experience. It is about 14 km away from Jhargram town. The temple is located in the forest beside a small, charming Dulung River. Several rare species of trees, birds, and monkeys can be seen here. There's a spot called Kendua on the way to Kanak Durga. Migratory birds visit the area in

#### Jhargram Zoological Park

About 2 km from the town. This Zoological Park was opened by the state forest department. Deer, snakes, crocodiles, black rabbit, wolf, peacocks, bears, and various types of monkeys and several varieties of trees can see here. It is a good place to visit with children.

Famous for its sylvan beauty, full of hilly terrain and meandering streams. Amlasole Hill stands as the witness to the dense, graceful forest beneath. During the full moon night and in spring, it creates a mesmerizing beauty. It has a variety of trees and forest products which tribes like Lodhas, Shabars, etc uses for their livelihood. Kankarajhor heartily welcomes you to enjoy this beauty of nature.

#### Gadrasini Hill

Gadrasini Hill is situated 8 km from Belpahari and 46 km from Jhargram. The serenity of this place will make you feel calm and peaceful. Gadrasini Ashram is situated here. It is inspired by the ideals of Lahiri Maharaj and Swami Yogananda, and a place for spiritual enlightenment. Every year in the month of Agharahayan a large no of spiritual seeker visit the place. The Gadrasini Hill is a paradise for colorful birds and a great place for bird watching.

In 1574 AD, Man Singh I of Kachwaha Rajput Raja of Amber (now Jaipur) came to conquer Bengal on the behest of Akbar, the Mughal emperor, Sarveshwar Singh, along with his elder brother, belonging to the Chauhan clan of Raiputs from Fatehpur Sikri were appointed to defeat Mallabhum's local tribunals. Mallabhum, included areas of present day Bankura, Paschim Medinipur and Jhargram was invaded by Raja Sarveshwar with the Rajput Military force and cavalry, they defeated the Mal Raja and as a result he adopted the imposition name Malla Dev and set up a kingdom by naming the place Jhargram which means a village encircled by dense forest. His victory is celebrated each year on Vijaya Dashmi day, Man Singh I resided here for a period of four months and later decided to return to Rajasthan. leaving his royal trusted Senapati Sarveshwar Singh as the Raja of Jhargram and his elder brother as the Raja of Bishnupur. Hence, a Fortress, which still exists behind the new Palatial Residence, was built for the royal family members to reside and rule the kingdom from this place. The new Palace is built in a very impressive way. It is constructed in the Indo-Saracenic style of architecture designed by Shri Khytish Chandra Biswas, the then Chief Valuer of Calcutta Improvement Trust, It has beautiful gardens and lawns inside and around the Palace. The work began during the reign of Raja Narasingha Malla Dev in 1922 AD, and the building was commissioned in 1931 AD. The Palace is so magnificently and artistically built that the interiors of the Palace recreate the memories of the past.
